PROGRAM UPDATES:



HEATING (ENERGY) and UTILITY ASSISTANCE:

New Milford Social Services is the local intake site for New Milford residents under the age of 60 seeking to apply for the following heating and energy assistance programs. Please contact our office for more information and guidelines to apply. [If you are over the age of 60 please contact the New Milford Senior Center]

- CT Energy Assistance Program (CEAP) Early application are now being taken for the upcoming winter season, prioritizing people with deliverable fuels or those with electric heat on a budget plan. *Please call us for an in-person appointment or an application packet to fill out and send back to us.* You will need to include all required income and relevant documentation with your application or in preparation for your appointment. An incomplete application can slow down the process.
- The first day for fuel deliveries is November 1, 2022 and a delay in completing your application can delay the certification process with our local community action agency (CAAWC).
- The State income guidelines for this program are:

60% SMI~ CEAP income guidelines: based on Family size



- All electric heated households who completed the Matching Payment program last year will be automatically re-enrolled onto Eversource's MPP. Remember that you still need to <u>re-apply</u> for Energy Assistance through our office every year! Eversource will send you a letter in November stating your NEW monthly budget payment. All payments need to be in by the end of each month, and *your first* six payments must be received by April 30th in order to get a "match". If Eversource raises your budget, pay the new amount if you can. If you cannot, pay the old amount and be sure to discuss this with us at the time of your application, you may qualify for a budget adjustment.
- Winter Protection Program helps protect your Eversource account from being shut off while you work on getting on and following through with a payment plan like NewStart or Matching Payment Program. Please call our office and we can code your account through this program. Eversource requires an income review to qualify for this program.
- Operation Fuel Winter/Spring program starting date will be announced in couple of months. Their Summer/Fall program is currently open to apply for Utility help, as long as funding is available. Remember, Operation Fuel's income guidelines go up to 75% of the State Median Income. Please call our office with inquiries.
- The **Community Fuel Bank** is also available for an emergency assist. Exploring the above programs is part of the process before CFB is accessible.

Sign Up OPEN: HOLIDAY PROGRAMS!

We are now accepting registration for Thanksgiving, Santa Fund and Disabled Adult gift programs. See the registration form on page 5 of this newsletter or pick one up at our office. Thanksgiving distribution will be Monday, Nov. 21st, time TBA. Disabled Adult program will be Thursday, Dec. 22nd during food bank. Distribution date for Santa Fund will be announced in our next newsletter. REGISTRATION DEADLINE IS NOV. 5th. Proof of income and residency is required for these

Proof of income and residency is required for these programs. If you have not shared your 2022 income with our office, now is the time to do it.

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We have ARPA funds to help assist persons with a financial need with rent, mortgage, utilities, medical-related, child-related or other household expenses. Need to demonstrate how COVID affected you financially anytime since 3/2020. Contact us for an application or find it on our website @ www.newmilford.org. *The town of NM also offers other APRA assistance for specific childcare and certain home rehabilitation needs.
